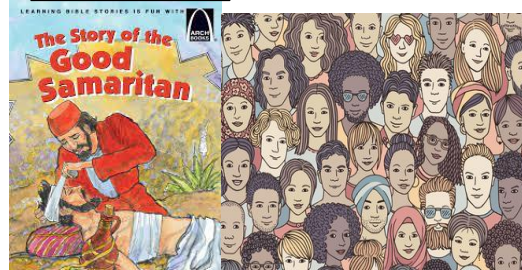


Key Vocabulary

Bible	Christian Holy Book. A collection of sacred texts.
Christians	People who follow the religion of Christianity.
unique	The only one, unlike anything else.
individuality	The character of a person or thing that distinguishes them from others.
humanist	A person who has a strong interest in or concern for others.
Samaritan	A helpful or charitable person.
Golden Rule	A basic rule that should always be followed.
Jewish	People who follow the religion of Judaism.
Sukkot	A 7 day Jewish festival held in Autumn.
Sukkah	A temporary shelter/hut covered in natural materials used during Sukkot.
Lulav	A bouquet made of palm, myrtle and willow branches plus an etrog (citron/lemon) that sends blessings to all.
Tzedekah	Hebrew word that means charity. An act of goodwill.
