**List 20:** Words with the vowel digraph er. In these words the sound is stressed and found in the middle of words.

**w/c: 8th June 2026**

Words with the vowel digraph 'er'. In these words the sound is unstressed and found at the end of words.

better	over	winter	river

**w/c: 15th June 2026**





Words with the digraphs 'ir' and 'ur'. Often found in the middle of words and occasionally at the beginning of words.

girl	bird	hurt	Thursday
shirt	first	burst

Words with the long vowel sound /oo/ as in zoo.

food	boots	zoo	boom
moon	afternoon	tool

**w/c: 29<sup>th</sup> June 2026**

Words where the short vowel sound 'oo' as in foot.

book	brook	wood	wool
foot	cook	shook	
good	took	stood	

**w/c: 6th July 2026**

Words where the 'oa' digraph can come at the beginning or in the middle of words but very rarely at the end. The 'oe' digraph can be sometimes found at the end of words

**Super Speller's challenge!**


Can you think of other words for each spelling rule? 3 = 1 merit!
