

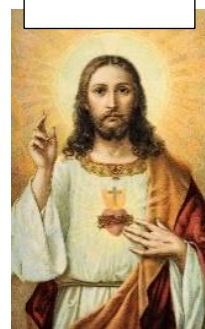
Key Vocabulary - Church

Easter	The oldest and most important Christian festival.
Christians	People who follow the religion of Christianity.
celebration	The action of celebrating an important day or event
resurrection	When Jesus came back to life.
disciples	The twelve followers of Jesus.
symbolise	When something stands for something else.
crucified	Put to death on a cross.
tomb	A place cut into rock or underground, where the dead are buried.
heaven	Christians believe this is where God lives and where good people go after death.
Jewish	People who follow the religion of Judaism.
Passover	Passover, also called Pesach in Hebrew, is a major Jewish holiday that occurs in the spring.
sedar plate	A special plate containing symbolic foods that are eaten during Passover

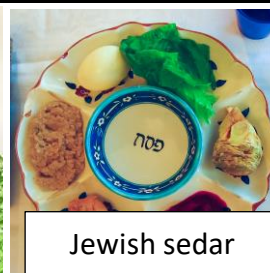
