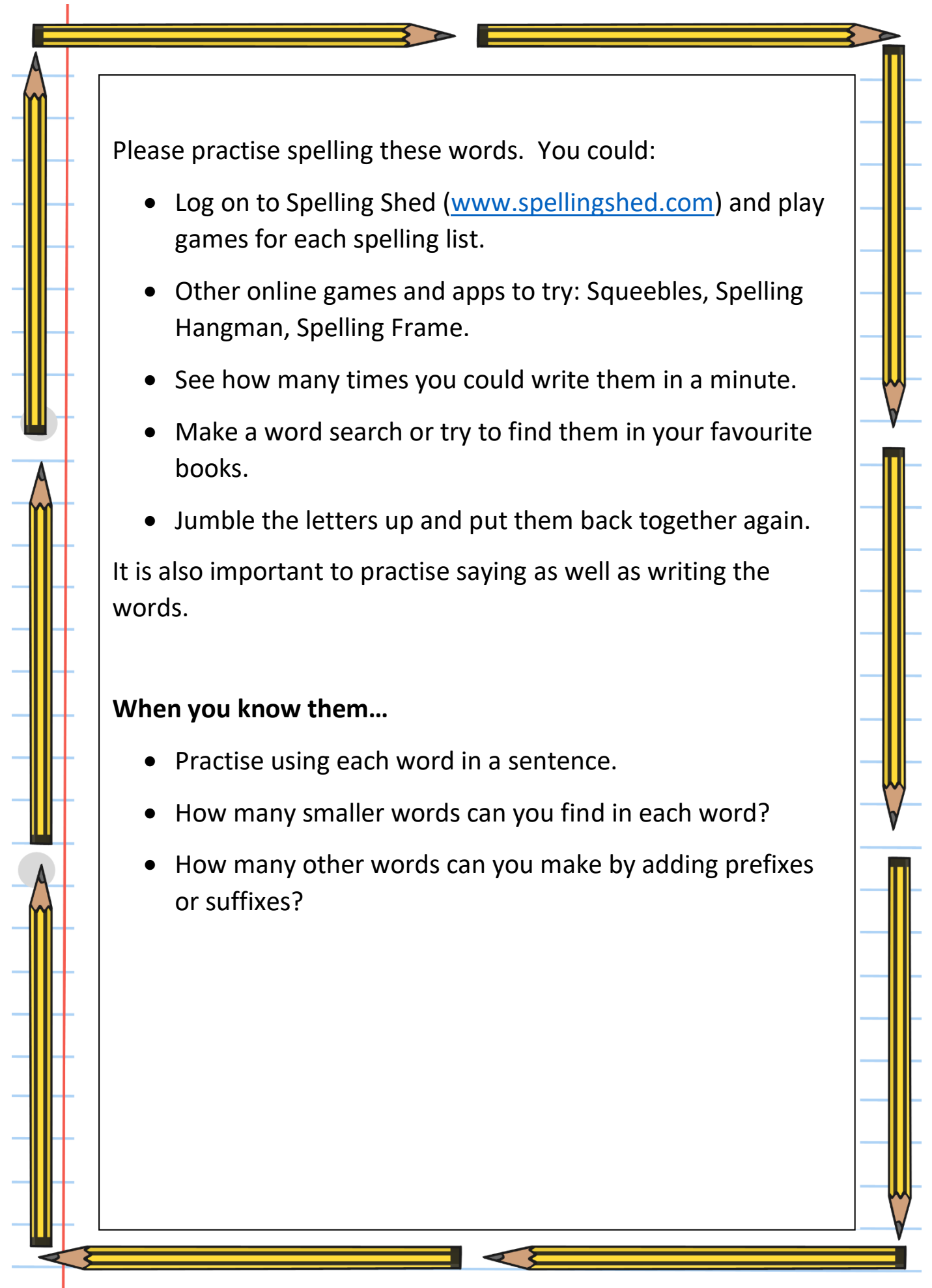
Super Speller's challenge!
